In Wales, 1 in 6 children and young people have a diagnosable mental health problem, signif cantly impact ng their experience of educat on, and many more struggle with Adverse Childhood Experiences which are directly connected to mental health problems in adulthood. Consequently, the Children's Commissioner has called for urgent act on to improve support for children and young people experiencing mental health dif cult es, especially following the Covid-19 pandemic. However, mental health problems among young people with intellectual and developmental disabilit es (IDD) are of en overlooked, underdiagnosed, and incorrectly at ributed to the person's IDD despite the prevalence of mental health problems in this populat on being several t mes that of the general populat on. Dialect cal Behaviour Therapy (DBT) is well documented as an effect ve approach for improving mental health and wellbeing in all populat ons. Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board have conducted promising preliminary work in determining the suitability of the DBT curriculum for use with those with IDD in schools. They have found that an adapt on of this curriculum could have a posit ve impact on the mental health and wellbeing, and subsequently access to quality educat on for children and young people with IDD.
